- 3. GUEST SPEAKER: Dr. Robbie Koerperich SUPERintendent for Holbrook School District. THANK YOU!! Talking to us about the CAFÉ project. (Community and Family Engagement) What it is, why it is a great thing, what the turnout was at Indian Wells. 15 years in Holbrook, District Boundaries cover 1500 sq miles, 1800 students in district. Some students (School Rated a B), 63% Native Americans. 19% Hispanic 12-13% white. Diversity is our strength. Graduation rates exceed the state average. 125 teachers, 300 support staff all together. Use the PASS System, try to focus on each kid and their total wellbeing. Try to keep social relationships healthy through the district and among 1800 students. Trying to make sure the kids are put in positions that they can succeed. Through the PASS system they've discovered they need more help. From the communities and through parents. They have been working with Tracy Bean with School Connect and they wondered how to better involve your community. They have developed the CAFÉ model. There are 9 different communities in the district. Love our Schools was a project they did in October. Encouraged schools AND communities to promote Love Our Schools. Job fairs, speakers, at the JR High they had a parent lunch where they would come in and give teachers a much-needed break. Each school can plan a CAFÉ day and had a Love Our Communities in the spring. Love Our Communities at Indian Wells was amazing (despite weather). They asked the students what they wanted. They had a competition, and kids did presentations. Kids voiced things they wanted to see in their community. It went over so well. This program allows us to open doors and partnership with the community. The first year of the CAFÉ went very well. Byproduct of what came out of the it is they had a community development meeting and discovered the school is an important element of growing the community. The school system can be the nucleus of growing the community with some help from the community, coalitions, families and business owners.
